Uses for the NAPP Patent Practice Forum:

1. Questions related to practice before the USPTO.

6. Notification of USPTO Rule changes.
7. Assistance to academic members having questions relating to preparation for the patent bar exam (e.g. - how to prepare for the exam).

Uses for the NAPP General Discussion Forum:

1. Notification of new and/or proposed legislation that affects patent prosecution practice.
2. Notification of new services or vendors offering goods/services of interest to patent practitioners.
